CHALLENGES IN PUBLIC TRANSPORT POSED BY THE PANDEMIC

- Huge decline in use of public transport
- Insufficient assistance and support from local
- Majority of public transport users do not feel safe in public transport
- vulnerable persons No specific actions taken to protect the health and safety of vulnerable people
- Limited communication with the public on health and safety issues in public transport
- No national research on impacts of the pandemic on public transport operations Insufficient traffic safety data

was the most frequently used type of transport before the pandemic, but private cars became the most preferred mode during the pandemic






